# Thirteenth Governing Board Meeting (GBM13) Regional Centre on Urban Water Management (RCUWM-Tehran)

(Under the auspices of UNESCO)

23 February 2023 (09:00- 12:00), Tehran—Iran



The Thirteenth Governing Board Meeting (GBM) of the Regional Centre on Urban Water Management (RCUWM) was held on 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2023 based on the approvals of the 12<sup>th</sup> GBM held virtually on 26 May 2021. H.E. Mr. Ali Akbar Mehrabian, the Chair and Minister of Energy, Islamic Republic of Iran as the host welcomed the participants to the 13th Governing Board (GB) meeting of RCUWM-Tehran. The Chair pointed out the cooperation formed by Iran and RCUWM's member states and organizations which has been well promoted during the past 20 years and has provided an appropriate base to address water challenges in the region. As cited this success is due to political mobilization of the governing board member states which have gathered together while being totally aware of the vital role of water in the region.

# **Presentations / Speeches**

### **UNESCO** representative (IHP Secretariat)

Mr. Abou Amani expressed his thanks for RCUWM tremendous works by asking member states to collaborate with the Centre to implement IHP IX. He also pointed out that UN 2023 conference on "Our watershed moment: uniting the world for water" will be held in New York in March 2023 and it will be a good opportunity for all RCUWM members to attend. He also mentioned that water issues are at the Centre of the SDGs and other related international agendas which demonstrates how important it is. A new agenda entitled "international committee on new global framework for biodiversity" has been recently discussed and approved in Montreal, Canada. Mr. Amani described IHP phase IX (2022-2029) and stated that it is based on member states' needs and challenges, therefore RCUWM and its member countries could play an important role in IHP working group "Groundwater and Human Settlements", in particular. He also mentioned that as the centre is hosting the International Drought Initiative (IDI), it should play a key role to revive this flagship initiative.





### Iraq, Minister of Water Resources

H. E. Mr. Awn Theab Abdullah stated that water is a key element for sustainable development and there is a need for taking sound water consumption into account in the region which is of arid and semi-arid climate. He also mentioned that regional cooperation, management and efforts through RCUWM capacities and capabilities are necessary to address regional challenges. H.E. mentioned that it is necessary to develop a collaborative platform including scientific ideas at regional scale for achieving water-related objectives of UNESCO and his country is ready to collaborate.

### Tajikistan, Minister of Energy and Water Resources

H.E. Mr. Delir Juma stated that UN General Assembly has adopted 10 resolutions on water which were initiated by Tajikistan during the past two decades. One of the major resolutions is the ongoing International Decade for Action: Water for Sustainable Development which Tajikistan initiated to govern and support and accelerate access to achieve the goals of the global development agenda. He also mentioned that the UN Water Conference (March 2023) is an excellent opportunity to review and evaluate the progress made in realizing the goals of the Water Decade. Tajikistan and the Netherlands will be leading the preparation of this global event.

### **Qatar, President of Qatar General Electricity and Water Corporation**

Mr. Al Kawari addressed some water challenges and issues in Qatar while his country has achieved the SDG6 (i.e., ensure access to water and sanitation for all) by taking benefit of modern practices on wastewater treatment. He stated that the 13th GB meeting would be a step to discuss water solutions, improve our capabilities in coping with ongoing regional water and food challenges.

### Armenia, Chairman of Water Committee

Mr. Gerigurian mentioned that Armenia presented three proposals in the 12th GBM (21 May 2021) that could be raised again and followed up as stated below:

- Enhancing the efficiency of water systems energy-saving facilities
- Financial mechanisms implementing wastewater treatment plant
- The protection of settlements, areas of economic value and the property of the
- population from the risk of floods and mudflows

### Oman, Ambassador of Oman to Iran

H.E. Mr. Al Moeini highlighted the necessity of cooperation for supporting RCUWM activities through organizing educational workshops and conducting research projects. He also raised the importance role of RCUWM in fulfilling water management objectives at regional and global scales and Oman's preparedness to closely work with the Centre and its members for achieving its goals.



### Lebanon, Ambassador of Lebanon to Iran

H.E. Mr. Hasan Abbas highlighted the importance of the SDGs and its targets such as improving water quality by reducing its pollution, increasing water use efficiency, practicing integrated water resources management by taking into consideration transboundary cooperation and protection and restoration of water related ecosystems. He also stated that in order to reach these goals regional and international cooperation is required. Mr. Abbas also mentioned that lack of funding has resulted in exacerbating water challenges. As for being involved in RCUWM activities he stated that new proposals should be forwarded to relevant ministries of the GB member states to be further investigated and decided.

### Bangladesh, Minister of Local Government, Rural Development and Co-operatives (Online)

H.E. Mr. Tajul Islam presented a short speech on the water conditions of his country focusing on floods, exploitation of groundwater resources, necessity of revising water plans to address current challenges our world is facing. He also mentioned that collaboration between UNESCO and GB member states in running joint relevant projects is required.

### Afghanistan, Deputy Minsiter for Water Affairs, Ministry of Energy and Water (Online)


H.E. Mr. Mujeeb- ur- Rahman Omar highlighted the importance of water in his country by describing the water shortage condition in Afghanistan, climate change impacts such as droughts and floods and demand growth due to population increase, instabilities and political conflicts as well as economic sanctions which have all made water accessibility a challenge. He also stated that interbasin water transfer is a solution for supplying water for mega cities. Mr. Omar also highlighted the role of water diplomacy in a fair and dynamic manner for effectively solving water problems among countries.

### Sri Lanka, Ambassador of Sri Lanka to Iran

By expressing his pleasure in attending the GB ministerial meeting on behalf of the Government of Sri Lanka, H.E. Mr. Wishwanah Aponsu stated that Sri Lanka is quite prepared to collaborate with RCUWM and its member states in solving water challenges.

### Oman Water Society, President of Oman Water Society

Mr. Saif Rashid Al Shaqsi addressed the water resources condition in Oman which is located in an arid region. He also highlighted the importance of preventing unauthorized groundwater resources exploitation. He suggested to determine the parties which are jointly planning to run RCUWM proposals by taking into consideration that the outcomes of project proposals should be practical.



# **Director's Report**

Mr. Hajrasouliha as RCUWM new director who stepped on board since September 2022 described the activities of the Centre between the 12th and 13th GBMs and pointed out the most important activities which the Centre is planning for 2023.

The director mentioned that the Centre has defined 8 proposals to be carried out with its member states within the coming years. The senior advisers of the Centre will further present the proposals by demonstrating the expected outcomes.

# **Comments and Approvals on the Director's Report**

The member representatives presented theirs comments and suggestions on the director's report and it was finally approved by the board members.

# **Presenting New Proposals by RCUWM**

RCUWM senior advisers presented a short overview on the project proposals, their objectives, method of implementation and expected outcomes and the floor was put to the Centre's member states and organizations for receiving their interests to be involved in running the projects jointly with RCUWM.

# **Interventions and Contributions by GB members**

The board members were then expected to present their interest to contribute to the proposals in general during this meeting and in detail by nominating their focal persons within 2 weeks time.

The following proposals were accepted to be run by the nominated members as follows:

- Mr. Zaib Tayyab, the counsellor of the Embassy of Pakistan to Iran stated that groundwater management is a key to achieve water and food security. So, Government of Pakistan endorses execution of proposal No. 1 on groundwater management at the regional scale. Pakistan Council of Research in Water Resources (PCRWR) has done an exceptional job by investigating and mapping of the entire Indus Plain Aquifer. Ministry of Resources of Pakistan would be happy to introduce a focal point for contributing to this proposal.
- Mr. Javanbakht as the Deputy Minister of Energy for Water and Wastewater Affairs
  declared that proposals 3 and 5 on water governance and drought management, respectively
  would be supported by the Water Sector of the Ministry of Energy, I.R. Iran as a
  contribution to RCUWM activities including conducting research project and capacity
  building.
- Mr. Matkan as the Secretary General of the Iranian National Commission for UNESCO stated that the Iranian Commission will collaborate with RCUWM in implementing proposals presented in the meeting. He also highlighted the need for renovating old water



network systems for reducing water leakage (Non-accounted water). Mr. Matkan mentioned that specific measures should be taken for improving water quality and mitigating climate change impacts for which the Iranian Commission is prepared to work with RCUWM and its member countries.

- Ms. Sarantuyaa from UNESCO headquarters stated that the proposals are all in line with IHP IX strategic plan. UNESCO-IHP supports proposals 3 (water governance), 4 (adaptation of urban water systems with climate change) and 6 (wastewater treatment and recycling which is in line with the circular economy in urban water management) in particular, through joint implementation with contribution of IHP secretariat and in collaboration with RCUWM.
- Mr. Noziri as ECO Secretary General stated that the optimal utilization of natural resources especially water remains on the top of ECO agenda for regional cooperation. The ECO member states have long been collaborating on water management issues. ECO believes in an integrated, well-coordinated and harmonized approach for governance of regional water resources. We support all those initiatives which are aimed at efficient and optimal utilization given the fact the water remains at all-time creating a need and requirement for the continuity of our existence. In this regard, ECO secretariat welcomes RCUWM and any proposals to work on joint regional projects, programs and mechanisms for developing an integrated system to ensure efficient water management in the region.
- Ms. Ozge Imamoglu as the Head of Department for International Organizations of Ministry
  of Agriculture and Forestry (Online) stated that the proposals should be elaborated more
  carefully by taking into consideration the mandate of RCUWM (i.e., urban water
  management). She mentioned that they would need to discuss the proposals with their
  experts for presenting concrete comments in due course for further collaboration and
  fruitful dialogue with RCUWM.
- Ms. Mehrdadi as the Director of Natural Sciences, UNESCO Tehran Cluster Office (UTCO) stated that UTCO is prepared to support RCUWM for the proposals presented in the meeting and future cooperation.
- Mr John Mai as the deputy Ambassador of India to Iran stated that all areas presented in the
  proposals are important ones in India and they have been working on them for a long time.
  It would be fruitful to consider a timeline to provide their technical comments on the
  proposals through determining a focal point with whom RCUWM could communicate.
- As an observer Mr. Torkzaban from Japan Cooperation Centre for the Middle East (JCCME) stated that Japan has great experience in the water and wastewater sector. They have already had cooperation with Iran Water Resources Management Company (WRMC) regarding proposal No. 2. JCCME holds valuable experience on proposals 6, 7, and 8 with National Water and Wastewater Engineering Company (NWWEC).
